

Team USA wins gold, silver and bronze

World Championships marked by magic moments



There are moments in this lifetime that take your breath away... that make your throat ache and bring tears to your eyes. Moments that bring you to your feet, cheering and screaming. The 34th World Baton Twirling Championships were filled with those moments.

Baton twirling fans here in the U.S. and around the world got to experience those magic moments. Some watched in person at the Silver Spurs Arena in Kissimmee, Fla. Others tuned in on their phone, tablet or computer to view the wildly successful World Championships Livestream, directed by Monica Lee and hosted by Jason Lee and Jonathan Burkin, all former World medalists.

The magic began as soon as 200 elite athletes from 16 countries

stepped onto the competition floor. We followed the highs and lows of Compulsories and Short Program. We cheered and crossed our fingers as our favorites stepped onto the floor. We held our collective breath as batons rocketed into the air and we whispered "get it" under our breath as they fell back toward earth.

"The standard of excellence was raised in both programming by the coaches and in the level of difficulty executed by the athletes," said World Baton Twirling Federation President Sandi Wiemers. "These exceptionally gifted athletes and coaches continue to push our sport to new heights."

We will never forget "Never Enough." Team USA member Laney Puhalla brought the powerful ballad from "The Greatest Showman" to beautiful life. After a disappointing compulsory round, Puhalla did two no drop, nearly flawless freestyles to win gold in the Junior Women's Division. That's something that hadn't happened in 24 years, since Alysha Depp won gold in 1994.

Next Team USA member Adaline Bebo, who had already earned the titles of first runner-up to Miss Texas, USTA Grand National Strut Champion and NBTA College Miss Majorette of America in June and July, wowed the crowd with a freestyle to Etta James' "At Last." The sweet and sultry program showed off her incredible flexibility and acrobatic skill and earned her a bronze medal in the Senior Women's Division.

Then Team USA member Savannah Miller traded her signature sassy style for a moving and deeply emotional program to a poignant, acapella version of "Amazing Grace" by Leanne Rimes. Her semifinals performance

quickly went viral, garnering more than 3.1 million views on social media. "Stunning," "incredible" and "magnifique" were just some of the comments from fans around the world who were amazed by the difficulty, creativity and passion of her performance.

We cheered for every member of Team USA. Each and every one of them made us proud. We were impressed as Japan's Tomoe Nishigaki earned her fifth consecutive gold medal. And we were awed by Team Japan, which earned perfect 100s in the Team Finals.

The week started with a record 193 athletes demonstrating their technical merit and ar-

tistic artistry in the U.S. PreTrials.

The international excitement continued on July 9 with the International Cup Qualifier, where 246 athletes competed for the chance to represent the U.S. at the 2019 International Cup in Bordeaux, France.
