

NEW JERSEY BATON COUNCIL HOSTS FIRST ANNUAL HOLIDAY CONTEST

What a wonderful way to bring in the holidays and kick off the 2018 competition season! The New Jersey Baton Council hosted its first annual Holiday Twirling Contest on Dec. 10 at the Nicholas Oresko School in Bayonne, New Jersey and it was a total success! I was honored to be the contest director and it was, all and all, a great day for baton twirlers in New Jersey. We had nine teams attend and 170 participants.

The contest began with a compulsory clinic with a great turn out of fifty athletes, followed by compulsory evaluations. Next, we had a parent marching competition, which was entertaining for both the athletes and audience, followed by foundation events; basic, military, parade march and presentation. We didn't have traditional medals or trophies; our awards consisted of stuffed animals with Star Line baton pencils, stickers and "I Love Twirling" towels. After our foundation events we had our holiday-themed team performances in front of a packed audience. The teams included the Buccanettes, Debutantes, Fusion, FYC, Highliters, Illumination, Starlets and a special New Jersey coaches team.

Sixteen coaches, including past Rutgers University feature

twirlers, past USTA National Champions and WBTF International Cup and World team members, performed to the Tran-Siberian Orchestra version of "Carol of Bells." We put the routine together via video and with only one practice the Friday before the competition. It went great and was so much fun! The twirling coaches of New Jersey are a special group because we have all been in the sport for well over twenty years, and most much longer. We all share the same passion for the sport of baton twirling. We usually see each other in a professional setting at competitions and it was a fun and delightful change to come together at a fun event where we can just enjoy the sport, have a fun day and twirl too. We also had a coloring contest that we sent with the brochure, an ugly sweater contest for both the parents and kids, pictures with Santa and goodie bags.

The NJ Holiday contest was inspired by Karen Cammer, Linda Boss and Keri Cooke at the iTwirl17 this past October in Bowie, Maryland. In one of the seminars, they helped jumpstart the USTA New Jersey Council since we have a large number of twirlers in New Jersey. We are excited to announce

Enjoy this Q&A with Michelle Dawson, president of the Colorado Baton Council. Although Colorado is a relatively small twirling state, it has had a strong council for many years and twirling in the state is growing under Dawson's leadership.

How did you initially get involved in baton twirling?

My mom signed me up through a recreation center. I loved it and started taking private lessons.

How have you been involved in twirling over the years....as an athlete, coach, judge, contest director, council member, USTA roles, etc.?

I started as an athlete and moved to coaching when I was in high school. I became a Certified Coach and have enjoyed coaching athletes who have won state, regional and national titles,

as well as athletes who have gone on to be collegiate feature twirlers. I was also interested in judging, so I pursued my judge's certification and am a Level III Judge. After college I started helping out the Colorado Baton Council as a council member and later became the Council President. For the past seven years, I have also been the Tabulation Director for USTA. I am responsible for tabulation at the U.S. Trials and the U.S. National Baton Twirling Championships, which includes the U.S. PreTrials, Festival of the Future and, in oddnumbered years, the International Cup Qualifier.

Tell me about your council – how many members, what types of events or activities it sponsors, special things it does, etc.?

We have a wonderful group of coaches and parents who support our council and we have more than 55 athletes who participate in our council contests and other special events. We host a clinic in conjunction with our November contest. One of our most popular events is offered at our February contest.

It's called Sweetheart Pairs, where an athlete performs with a "sweetheart"

of their choice, often a dad, brother or grandfather.

At our March competition we hold a pageant event where athletes compete in modeling, interview, basic or presentation and solo. Finally, at our State Championships each year, we recognize our graduating high school seniors.

What is the biggest challenge and the biggest reward of being a council president?

The biggest challenge is trying to bring a variety of judges to our contests. Schedules and the cost of airfare make that a constant challenge. The biggest reward is seeing an athlete enjoy the contest and want to continue twirling.

What are the qualities of a successful council president?

Organization, communication and relationship-building.

Are there folks you would like to thank?

There are so many parents that help out at each contest I can't list them all. And all of our local coaches are very supportive. One special person
